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## DDA Authority Meeting

Delhi Development Authority held its meeting on 10.02.2021 through video conferencing under the chairmanship of Shri Anil Baijal, Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Delhi/Chairman, DDA attended by Shri Anurag Jain, IAS, Vice Chairman, DDA and other members of the Authority.

### Following major decisions were taken:

**Draft Green Development Area Policy (GDA):** The Authority approved the Draft 'Green Development Area Policy' to provide an integrated framework for development of lands falling in the designated green belt and Low Density Residential Area (LDRA) as per MPD-2021. The same shall be processed under Section 11A of DD Act. The Policy will be put in Public domain for inviting objections/suggestions. The objection/suggestions shall be placed before the Board of Enquiry and Hearing. As per the recommendations of BOEH, the same shall be placed before the Authority for final approval and onward forwarding to MoHUA for notification.

The Policy will encourage 'green development' and will ensure seamless development of infrastructure and road network within and around GDA. Under the draft Policy, a three rung graded approach for development of lands falling under GDA has been adopted - Grade 1, Grade 2, Grade 3. The Policy provides a comprehensive framework defining minimum land area required

for green development i.e for Grade 1 minimum plot area required is 600 sqm, minimum 4,000 sqm for Grade 2 and minimum 10,000 sqm for Grade 3. Accordingly FAR have also been prescribed depending on proposed grade of development ranging from 5 in case of Grade 1, FAR 20 for Grade 2 and FAR 60 for Grade 3. The Policy allows for incentivised development on agglomerated land parcels of bigger size. It also enumerates permissible uses, activities / mix of activities, parking and other mandatory provisions.

For instance in Grade 3 a wide range of activities such as higher education campuses (including vocational training), non-polluting work centres like cyber and knowledge industry, Research & Development, agro processing and packaging, cold storage, green houses, convention and exhibition centres, concert spaces, stadiums, cultural performance spaces, museums, art galleries etc. have been allowed. The Green Development Area Policy is primarily a Green oriented development characterized by large wooded areas, landscaped areas. The mandatory wooded area shall be increased as per the grade change. with minimum 45% of the plot area in case of Grade 3 development.

All the parameters related to green buildings, green infrastructure and zero discharge complexes will have to be adopted while undertaking development of the land by the respective land owners. Incentives and disincentives for not adhering to the Green Ratings schemes approved thereunder have been prescribed. This shall ensure a composite and sustainable development in the areas covered under the GDA Policy.



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This Policy is expected to facilitate the land owners to utilise their lands for economic uses, thereby minimizing misuse, unauthorized construction and ensuring balanced development.

Besides, the Authority has approved the following proposals:

**Solid Waste Plant:** The proposal for change of land use from Recreational to Utility (U4) of 10.99 acres area was approved under Section 11A of DD Act for establishment of Solid Waste Management Facilities (for processing of C&D Waste) at Tehkhand Zone F. Now public objections & suggestions will be invited for 30 days as per the statutory provisions. If final approval is granted the said land shall be allotted to South Delhi Municipal Corporation. Latterhand adjoining the sites already earmarked for new Waste to Energy Plant. This will facilitate recycling of waste and reduction of solid waste impact on the environment. Further, 46.2 acres of land which is presently being utilised for sanitary land fill to be handed back to DDA on its closure.

**Utilisation of vacant land earmarked for Nursery schools:** For better utilisation of land resources, a proposal for use of vacant and unallotted nursery school sites and plots for other uses was also approved. These vacant nursery school sites can now be earmarked for uses allowed as part of neighbourhood facilities.

The sites can be allotted for primary school and senior secondary school as per the prescribed CBSE norms on its own or by way of amalgamation of adjacent plots in the layout plan as a first priority. The residential use may also be allowed in case of Nursery school sites sandwiched between the residential plots by modifying the layout plans. The proper utilization of these sites will ensure planned development of lands lying vacant ensuring value addition for the neighbourhoods.

## DDA unveils a sustainable development-oriented budget : Narela gets a big boost

Delhi Development Authority, in its meeting held on 10.02.2021, chaired by the Lt. Governor, NCT Delhi approved the annual budget for 2021-22, with an annual outlay of Rs. 6,738 crore and receipts have been projected at Rs. 6749 crore.

A significant component of the expenditure is earmarked for Narela sub-city Development Area. Significant allocations have also been made for transport infrastructure projects such as grant to DMRC towards construction of Phase -IV metro line for Rithala-Bawana-Narela corridor and construction of UER –II stretch in Delhi through NHAI. The development oriented budget also lays special emphasis on rejuvenation of Water Bodies and the Yamuna River Front.

### Budget 2021-22 Highlights:

**Master Plan (MPD) 2041:** The process of preparation of MPD 2041, initiated in 2017, remained on track in spite of the lockdown and other restrictions on account of the pandemic. The draft MPD 2041 is expected to be ready in time by March 2021 for statutory approvals. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹ 17 crores].**

## Civic Infrastructure- (Special emphasis on development of Narela)

- A provision of Rs. 2326 crore has been provided for development of land and physical infrastructure facilities such as roads, sewerage, water supply, power lines and drainage mainly in the sub cities of Narela, Dwarka and Rohini under development.
- DDA is committed to provide Rs 1000 crore in a phased manner for **Rithala-Bawana-Narela** corridor of Delhi Metro Phase IV projects. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹ 400 crores].**
- It has been decided to complete the **Urban Extension Road –II (UER)** project at the earliest. It will significantly enhance the connectivity of the sub cities of Dwarka, Rohini, Narela and the proposed land pooling areas with the rest of Delhi and the neighbouring states. By connecting the major national highways, it will contribute significantly towards easing heavy traffic congestion on Delhi roads and in improving the air quality. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹100 crores].**
- Construction of **4 Foot Over Bridges (FOBs)** in Dwarka to provide safe passage to pedestrians. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹ 8 crores].**
- The **construction of a Flyover cum Railway Over Bridge (ROB)** in Narela is expected to be completed by March, 2021. **[BE 2021-22 provision-₹6 crores].**

- A concept plan for **development of Narela sub city** for its vacant/available land usage is being prepared by a consultant and its report is likely to be expected by March 2021.
- Construction work of **SW drain at sector-8, Dwarka [ TD2 and TD 5]** has been undertaken to regulate the discharge of drain water of Airport. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹9 crores]**.
- Construction of Approach Road from Chhattarpur to SAARC University **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹30 crores]**.

### **Environmental initiatives: Parks, Water Bodies and Yamuna River Front**

- The work for the development of the iconic **Bharat Vandana Park** in Dwarka Sub-city has already commenced. The project spread over an area of 80 hectares is being executed by NBCC. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹280 crores]**. The work has been awarded.
- DDA has played a key role in the overall development and management of green spaces in the city. DDA... has prepared an action plan for rejuvenation of 41 water bodies. Work in respect of 10 of these water bodies has been completed and 13 others is nearing completion. Work for the remaining water bodies will also be taken up on priority which is likely to be completed by 31.03.2022. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹ 40 crores]**.

- There are 787 parks under DDA having a total area of 11258 acres. The total maximum average daily water requirement is 34.3ML per Day. The work of setting up Decentralized STPs/Wastewater Treatment Plants so as to close bore wells supplying water to the city parks is being taken up in a phased manner and steps are also being taken to recharge the bore wells. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹10 crores]**.
- DDA has also undertaken the work of rejuvenation and restoration of the flood plains of River Yamuna. The work is being taken up in a phased manner as 10 separate sub projects. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹105 crores]**.
- An outlay of Rs. 112.40 crore has also been provided towards development and maintenance of city parks maintained by DDA.

### **Promotion of Sports:-[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹410 crores]**

- Construction of Three New Sports Complexes at Dwarka and one at Rohini.
- Construction of Golf Course at Dwarka.
- Maintenance expenditure of 18 sports complexes and 2 golf courses.
- Construction of a Sports Complex at Dwarka on PPP basis.

## Housing

- DDA is the nodal agency for execution of 376 JJ clusters for the ambitious mission **"Housing for all" under... Pradhan Mantri AwaasYojna (Urban)**. For 3 JJ clusters at Kalkaji extension, Jailor Wala Bagh and Kathputli colony, construction of 7500 EWS houses is in progress which is likely to be completed by December 2021. RFP for four in situ slum rehabilitation projects comprising approximately 7100 households is likely to be floated in March 2021. Tender for more in situ slum rehabilitation projects in each quarter is projected to be floated by December 2021 for 26,500 houses.
- All ongoing housing projects of DDA are likely to be completed in 2021-22. An allocation of Rs.1100 Crore has been provided for completion of the ongoing housing projects in 2021-22.

## Refurbishments/Upgradation of Commercial Centres

- DDA had identified three commercial centres - Nehru Place, Bhikaji Cama Place and BasantLok Community Centre for upgradation. The work of upgradation of the BasantLok Community Centre has already been completed. The work in respect of Nehru Place and Bhikaji Cama Place. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹46 crores]**.

## Promotion of Socio-Cultural Activities:

- Construction of Utsav pandals at Madangir, Dwarka, Rohini and CBD Shahdara - **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹13.50 crores]**.

## New Initiatives

- DDA has also undertaken a project which involves integrated development based on Transit-Oriented Development norms with mixed land usage on 30 hectares of land at Karkardooma. The first-of-its-kind East Delhi Hub project is being executed by NBCC. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹500 crores]. The tenders have been floated.**
- DDA has planned a dedicated corridor track for cyclists and pedestrians. The Delhi Cycle Walk project is being planned with the objective to take a large number of car rides out of the Delhi roads. The work on Phase 1 of the Delhi cycle walk with a dedicated corridor for cyclists and pedestrians named Neelgai line from Badarpur to Malviya Nagar has been initiated. **[BE 2021-22 provision - ₹28 crores]**.

## 62<sup>nd</sup> Special Task Force meeting

The 62<sup>nd</sup> meeting of STF was held on 12.02.2021 wherein officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 31<sup>th</sup> January was reviewed.

In total 73,757 complaints have been received in STF till 31<sup>st</sup> January 2021 and action on 67,111 complaints has been initiated. 614 ATR were received during the period from 16.01.2021 to 31.01.2021. Since the constitution of STF in 2018, more than 3200 unauthorised constructions have been demolished and more than 2200 properties have been sealed. Other kinds of action have also been taken up with concerned agencies such as DJB, Electricity, Revenue which comes to more than 2800. In addition to this, more than 7500 active actions have been taken up by the ULBs on unauthorised constructions.

Chairman, STF directed the ULBs to take the matter seriously and expedite the action on the pending cases.

During 16.01.2021 to 31.01.2021, Encroachment Removal Action by SDMC at areas including RK Puram Sector-5, Car Market, Sector-07, Sector-08 and Sector-09, Mohan Singh Market and surrounding area on 20.01.2021 and Guru Ravi Dass Marg, DDA Flats Kalkaji, S-Block GK-II and S-Block Main Road Near Chandan Market on 25.01.2021.

Encroachment Removal Action from Govt. land taken by Revenue Deptt., SDMC, PWD and Delhi Police at areas at MB road on 22.01.2021, approximately 3000 sqm land handed over to PWD.

Anti-Encroachment drive was carried out by NDMC in areas including Connaught Place and Palika Bazar, Gole market, Janpath, Regal Rivoli and Shanker market, Safdarjung, AIIMS, LBN market, INA, Sarojini Nagar and Chanakyapuri and VIP area.

Demolition of unauthorised construction by North DMC in Nihal Vihal, Karampura, Baljeet Nagar and Rohini.

Chairman, STF re-iterated that close co-ordinated efforts needs to be continued by the ULBs & Govt. Agencies to take actions for removal of encroachment in accordance with the law. Police Deptt. assured that all support shall be provided to remove the encroachment from roads and take action on unauthorised construction effectively.

## 63<sup>rd</sup> Special Task Force meeting

The 63<sup>rd</sup> meeting of STF was held on 25.02.2021 wherein officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 15<sup>th</sup> February was reviewed.

In total 75,565 complaints have been received in STF till 15<sup>th</sup> February 2021 and action on 69,520 complaints has been initiated. 2409 ATR were received during the period from 01.02.2021 to 15.02.2021. Since the constitution of STF in 2018, more than 3270 unauthorised constructions have been demolished and more than 2240 properties have been sealed. Other kinds of action have also been taken up with concerned agencies such as DJB, Electricity, Revenue which comes to more than 2990. In addition to this, more than 7500 active actions have been taken up by the ULBs on unauthorised constructions.

Chairman, STF directed the ULBs to take the matter seriously and expedite the action on the pending cases.

During 01.02.2021 to 15.02.2021, Encroachment Removal Action by SDMC at areas including Vasant Kunj and surrounding area on 01.02.2021; PVR Complex Vasant Lok, Vasant Vihar, Gurudwara to Indian Airlines Colony Road Vasant Vihar, Durga Bai Metro Station, DhaulaKuan on 02.02.2021; B-7

Market Vasant Kunj, Main Road Masoodpur, Basant Square Mall, Delhi Jal Board Road Vasant Kunj and J.J. Bandhu Camp Vasant Kunj on 08.02.2021; Sector-5, Sector-6, Sector-8, Mohan Singh Market, Vivekanand Marg both side, Indra Market, Sector-5, RK Puram on 11.02.2021 and B-1 Vasant Kunj, B-6 Vasant Kunj and surrounding area on 15.02.2021.

Demolition Programme by EDMC in areas of Harsh Vihar, Dilshad Garden and Ganga Vihar.

Anti-Encroachment drive was carried out by NDMC in areas including Connaught Place and Palika Bazar, Golemarket, Janpath, Laxmi Nagar, Regal Rivoli and Shanker market, Safdarjung, Sarojini Nagar and Chanakyapuri, MotiBagh.

Demolition programme by North DMC at Sector 3, Rohini on 08.02.2021, Karol Bagh on 08.02.2021, Chawri Bazar on 12.02.2021, MalkaGanj on 09.02.2021, Kewal Park Extension on 08.02.2021 and Wazirabad on 10.02.2021.

Chairman, STF re-iterated that close co-ordinated efforts needs to be continued by the ULBs & Govt. Agencies to take actions for removal of encroachment in accordance with the law. Police Deptt. assured that all support shall be provided to remove the encroachment from roads and take action on unauthorized construction effectively.
