## February 19: Azaadi Darshan

DDA celebrated the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of India's independence through a series of events - themed around 'Rejuvenation of River Yamuna floodplains'. The organization planned several nature-oriented activities along the floodplains of River Yamuna every weekend from 19<sup>th</sup> February 2022 to 6 March 2022. The aim of the celebrations is to revive the holy river's connection with its people and spread awareness about its significance which has faded away over the years.

DDA celebrated its inaugural event Azadi darshan, a sand art workshop on 19<sup>th</sup> February as part of 'Azaadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' to commemorate the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of India's Independence. This first-of-its-kind event-cum-workshop, held in the capital city, was organized at Kalindi Aviral, one of the DDA's Yamuna project sites, under the guidance of renowned sand artist Mr. Manas Kumar Sahoo. Mr. Sahoo has elevated India's sand art and carved a name for himself and the country globally.

Over 250 participants of all age groups enthusiastically took part in the workshop, making sand art and sculptures. The team of students and teachers from Rajkiya Pratibha Vikas Vidyalaya and Aaghaaz-e-taleem, an NGO as well as several volunteers, took part in the workshop and created beautiful sand art pieces on themes of independence, heritage, environment, art and science.

The event was graced by Vice- Chairman of DDA, Sh. Manish Gupta as the event's chief guest. Besides boosting everyone's morale, he presented participation certificates to all the students, participants.

The second event of the series, Nature Walk, was held on Sunday, 20<sup>th</sup> Feb 2022, at Yamuna Biodiversity Park Phase-2, an active floodplain of Yamuna, away from the hustle-bustle of the city. The walk would be lead by members of Delhi Bird Foundation, Pankaj, Samart and Sourajit.







## February 20: Nature Walk

A Nature walk was held on Sunday morning at the active floodplains of River Yamuna at Yamuna Biodiversity Park Phase 2. This is the second event organised by DDA themed around 'Rejuvenation of River Yamuna floodplains' as a part of celebration of 'Azaadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' to commemorate 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of India's Independence. DDA's Vice Chairman Mr. Manish Kumar Gupta, Principal Commissioner (Landscape) Mr. Rajeev Kumar Tiwari, Chief Engineer (North) Mr. Gajender Singh and Chief Engineer (East Zone) Mr. Ravikant also stepped forward and explored birding with the experts. The walk was led by the ornithologists from Delhi Bird Foundation (DBF).

DBF is a team of enthusiast birders with a common passion to conserve nature for our future through partnership and collaborations with other leading organisations and local communities. They have represented the country in key international birding events and are connected with renowned global birding ornithologists and experts.

Their aim is to empower people to make a positive impact on wildlife and nature. DBF also celebrated the Big Bird Day on 20<sup>th</sup> February 2022. On this day, members of the Foundation split in groups and was spotted differently varieties of bird species all across the open spaces in and around Delhi.





Over 100 participants including bird enthusiasts, nature lovers and officers of DDA took part in this walk who were divided in groups led by DBF members. Samarth Khanna, Pankaj Gupta and Sourajit led the groups to explore the flora, fauna and avifauna of the floodplains of River Yamuna.

Around 90 species of birds were spotted by the groups that included resident species and migratory birds from various other countries flocking in and around the site. Some of the species that were spotted included : Spot billed duck, Purple Moorhen, Russian collar duck, Grey head Swampen,



Yellow footed pigeon, Common babbler, Common coot, Painted stork, Grey babbler, Ashy prinia, Eurasian Collared dove, Pond heron, Red-naped ibis, Pink painted stork, Black Drongo and Red whiskered bulbul. The birders shared the tales of the spotted species and their symbiotic relationship with their corresponding habitats. Trees native to the floodplains like tamarix, ber, Mahua, sheesham were also seen.

Over the years , DDA in coordination with CEMDE has worked hard to make Yamuna Biodiversity Park a home to the biodiversity in the city. Next in the series of events was the Jagrukta Abhiyan proposed on 26<sup>th</sup> Feb, which is an awareness programme aimed at making people conscious of the climate change and its impacts on everyday lives and activities.



## February 26: Jagrukta Abhiyaan

DDA in collaboration with the Centre for Environmental Management of Degraded Ecosystems (CEMDE) organized Jagrukta Abhiyaan, an awareness programme on Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> February 2022 at Yamuna Biodiversity Park Phase-1. The event addressed the impacts of climate change on everyday lives and the role of biodiversity parks in climate resilience. This was the third event organized by DDA themed around 'Rejuvenation of River Yamuna floodplains' to celebrate 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' to commemorate the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of India's Independence.

The event witnessed extensive participation of more than 200 students from Daulat Ram College, Hansraj College, Dayal Singh College (Evening), Mata Sundri College, PG DAV College (Evening), Delhi Institute of Advanced Studies, Guru Govind Singh College of Commerce and Guru Ram Das College of Education.

The participants were addressed by Dr Faiyaz A. Khudsar, Scientist In-charge of the Biodiversity Parks Program followed by nature walks led by Scientists, ecologists and nature education officers Ekta Khurana, Preeti, Harmik, Ranjeeta who interacted with students and ignited the young minds to conserve our natural heritage i.e. floodplains of River Yamuna. Strolling through the dense woody vegetation, sprawling grasslands, where native species have been constituted in the form of biological communities,



the students comprehended how a barren and degraded landscape has been conserved and evolved into the model of environmental sustainability and resilience. The role of Biodiversity Parks to mitigate the impact of climate change and adapt to extreme weather conditions was also discussed. The students experienced their connection with nature by looking at gigantic trees of Kaith, Arjun, Jamun, Palash, Amaltash, Harad, Bahera and Chilbil and huge numbers of resident and migratory birds in and around the wetlands.

Yamuna Biodiversity Park, a jewel in Delhi's Green Treasure has been jointly developed by the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) and Centre for Environmental Management of Degraded Ecosystems (CEMDE), University of Delhi and is one of the fully operative Biodiversity Parks. One can experience natural tranquillity amid its ambient silence.



It is a habitat to a diversity of forest communities, biologically rich wetlands, grassland communities, a wide variety of fruit yielding species and an abundance of medicinal herbs. The Park features two major zones: the visitor zone and the nature reserve zone. There is a Nature Interpretation Centre that provides an insight into the basic concepts of Biodiversity and showcases various development stages of the park.

The programme ended with the assembly of students at Nature Interpretation Centre with a thought-provoking session by the scientists of the Yamuna Biodiversity Park. Shri Kulbir Singh, Director (Hort.), DDA gave vote of thanks elaborating the importance of Biodiversity Parks for providing ecological services to the society and the need of awareness amongst the younger generation.



## February 27: SwachhtaAbhiyaan

An initiative to clean the banks of the River Yamuna was taken up in the fourth event - Swachhta Abhiyaan that was held on Sunday morning on 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2022 at Qudsia Ghat. A number of nature oriented activities are being organised by Delhi Development Authority as a part of celebration of 'Azaadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' to commemorate 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of India's Independence.

DDA's Vice Chairman Mr. Manish Kumar Gupta accompanied by more than 70-75 senior officers of the organisation came forward and led this campaign on Qudsia Ghat along Yamuna near Kashmere Gate. Enormous amounts of waste is generated during the festivities along the river banks in the form





of puja material and got trapped eventually affecting the quality of the floodplains. The officers assisted with support of the cleaning staff of North Delhi Municipal Corporation (NDMC) who participated in cleaning a stretch of approximately 700 - 750 mts along the river. About 12 trucks of waste was collected during the event and safely disposed off.

The last leg of this event themed around the 'Rejuvenation of River Yamuna floodplains' will witness two of the events to be held next Saturday and Sunday at Asita West - Yogabhyas and Avartan Rally near Old Delhi.

## Chairman STF reviews progress at 80<sup>th</sup> Meeting

The 80<sup>th</sup> meeting of STF was held on 04.02.2022 where officers from all the local bodies and other concerned agencies were present. The progress of the complaints received up to 31<sup>th</sup> January 2022 was reviewed.

In total 1,19,220 complaints have been received in STF till 31<sup>st</sup> January 2022 and action on 1,14,4073 complaints have been initiated. 2651 ATR were received during the period from 16.01.2022 to 31.01.2022. Since the constitution of STF in 2018, more than 4100 unauthorised constructions have been demolished and more than 2600 properties have been sealed.

Encroachment removal action was taken by SDMC at areas including Indira Prem nath Dogra Marg on 19.01.2022 and 20.01,2022 Press Enclave Road, Malviya Nagar Metro Station, Khirki Village on 21.01.2022, Shop No. B-9 & B-10 Alaknanda Market Shopping Complex, Raghunath Mandir, Uday Shankar Park near MCD Community Centre, G K - II on 25.01.2022 and MIG Flats Triveni Apartment, Thursday Weekly Bazaar Sheikh Sarai Phase-1 on 27.01.2022.

Encroachment removal action was taken by NDMC at areas including Connaught Place, Palika Bazar, Gole Market Janpath, Regal Rivioli, Sarojini Nagar, Safdarjung, Shankar Market, VIP area and Chanakyapuri.

Chairman, STF re-iterated that close co-ordinated efforts needs to be continued by the ULBs & Govt Agencies to take actions for removal of encroachment in accordance with the law. Police Deptt. assured that all support shall be provided to remove the encroachment from roads and take action on unauthorized construction effectively.
